WHO WE ARE

- Transit for all PA! is a statewide coalition of transit riders, transit workers, and transit-supportive organizations and businesses. Together, we are working to expand Pennsylvania's public transit systems to grow our economy and connect more Pennsylvanians to jobs, healthcare, and essential needs.
- Hundreds of riders and workers collectively built the Transit for All PA platform in 2021
- Since then, we have hosted petitions, led phone banks and town halls, papered every PA legislator, and rallied in Harrisburg, organizing over 45,000 riders, operators, and advocates



OUR DEMANDS

- Restore statewide service to 2019 levels + 10% more outside of Philly & Pittsburgh
- Dedicated funding for transit operation
- Enabling local capital funding
- Local control of fare enforcement
- Transportation project prioritization with PennDOT



WHAT HAPPENED IN THE BUDGET?

- No new transit funding anywhere
 - Last House package passed: Gov.
 Shapiro's proposal + HB 1364
 - You raised the floor of debate
- Transit For All PA Funding Package
 - Rideshare component
 - Car rental fee + Car Lease Tax components
 - HB 1523 & 1524; SB 795 & 796, each with statewide cosponsors



WHAT HAPPENED IN THE BUDGET?

- SEPTA + PRT Capital "flex"
 - Largest agencies rob safety and accessibility, to temporarily preserve service
 - SEPTA's trains ruled an imminent fire hazard by FTA - Shapiro *second* flex for required fixes
- Paratransit/shared-ride, and the rest of PA? No help is on the way from state government

SERVICE CUTS ARE COMING FOR EVERYONE

- March 2020
 - EMTA, serving Erie County, ends Sunday service
- **9** July 2025

Bellefonte borough - county seat of Centre County - and Benner Township lose fixed-route service due to hikes in local match requirements by CATA

July 2025

CATA, serving Centre County, increases bus fares by 14%



SERVICE CUTS ARE COMING FOR EVERYONE

August 2025

SEPTA serving Philadelphia and its four collar counties temporarily cuts 20% of service, and permanently raises fares to a nation-high \$2.90. Cuts are only reversed when the agency is forced to raid its entire state capital budget allocation for the next two years

January 2026

Lehigh and Northampton counties increase fares by at least 25%, and bus service is cut by 20%

9 July 2026

Rabbittransit, serving Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, York, and 11 other counties, faces enormous fare hikes for shared-ride service, and 25% service cuts

December 2026


South Central Transit Authority, serving Berks and Lancaster County, will hit its fiscal cutoff

January 2027

Monroe, Washington, and Westmoreland counties hit their transit agencies' fiscal cliffs, bringing service cuts and fare increases

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SERVICE ACROSS PA SINCE COVID






2025 RECAP + STATE OF OUR MOVEMENT

- 45,000 of you took action
 - 400,000 letters sent to legislators
 - Actions taken in ALL 253 legislative districts
- 350+ of you rallied in Harrisburg
 - Attendees from 13 counties
 - Every legislator learned about our campaign riders and workers
 - 8 legislative meetings with constituents




2025 RECAP + STATE OF OUR MOVEMENT



- Survey and canvass local transit riders
 - Grow the Transit For All PA Base.

Public meeting(s)

- Get on the same page as your local (and statewide) community
- Identify a shared demand and agree on a shared plan to amplify it

Visible action

- Op-eds, testimony at board meetings, meetings with elected officials, or press events
- Elevating transit needs locally, to show that transit matters everywhere
